Great Lakers Birthday Rally Recap, May 13 – 17, 2019 in Holland, Michigan



The Great Lakers had a great start to the 2019 rally season with our club's 43rd Birthday Rally held this year at the Dutch Treat Campground in Zeeland, Michigan. Zeeland is a small town near the famous town of Holland, Michigan. While our rally was held immediately after the conclusion of the annual Tulip Festival in Holland, we were able to enjoy all the beautiful tulip displays around town.

This year was the 90th Anniversary of the Tulip Festival in Holland. Each fall close to 1,000,000 tulips arrive from the Netherlands and are planted at Windmill Island Gardens, along the sidewalks in downtown, in the local parks, and along the street streets in the residential neighborhoods in Holland, Michigan. This year's weather cooperated nicely and we were able to see rows and rows of beautiful tulips everywhere. Many of the Great Lakers took time during the week to tour the De Zwaan ("the Swan" or "Graceful Bird") Windmill at Windmill Island gardens. De Zwaan Windmill is

America's only authentic, working Dutch windmill. The windmill was brought to America from the town of Vinkel from the province of Noord Brabant in the Netherlands to the city of Holland, Michigan. It was the last Dutch windmill to leave the Netherlands. It arrived in Holland, Michigan in October 1964 and took 6 months to reconstruct. The windmill grinds oat and corn flour when the winds permit. It was quite a treat to tour the different levels inside the windmill to learn about all its working components.

The Executive Board members hosted the Birthday rally. There was the usual coffee, fruit and pastries each morning of the rally, along with a catered hot breakfast, and a catered barbecue on our last night with birthday cake and ice cream for dessert! Many thanks to Joe Gillen who provided some of the yummy rally pastries! Rally meals and activities took place at the recreation building at the Dutch Treat Campground. Becky Johnson gave her GMC Motorhome presentation to rally participants that she gave earlier in May at Macomb County College, along with display boards and additional GMC videos. It was really nice to have a heated building with tables, chairs, and plenty of space all to ourselves. Each Great Lakers member who attended the May rally received a complimentary rally T-shirt. (There are a few leftover rally T-shirts so look for some future rally give aways!)

There were 46 participants registered for the rally with 20 coaches plus Tom Dixon's Casita camper. 
Report on GMC Presentation at Macomb County Community College - May 3, 2019


As reported in the April 2019 GMC Great Lakers newsletter, our club was invited by Macomb County Community College in Clinton Twp., Michigan to participate in their annual cultural program at the college. This year's program theme was "The 70's". Great Lakers President, Becky Johnson gave a 45 minute PowerPoint presentation that highlighted the background of the GMC Motorhome. Using historical photographs and edited clips of dealer videos from the 1970s, the presentation briefly explained – What is a GMC motorhome? Why did GM build it? How did GM build it? Where was it built? What happened to the GMC motorhome? The presentation concluded with a history of the GMC Great Lakers club. In addition to the presentation, there were three GMC motorhomes on hand in the parking lot for an open house for anyone who wanted to tour them. Bill Helmore brought his 1978 Palm Beach (in restored original like condition), Steve and Becky Johnson had their 1977 Eleganza II (restored with some modernized updates), and Greg and Karen Breen-Bondi brought their 1978 Buskirk Royale (as restored by Buskirk).

Approximately 114 people attended the GMC presentation, which included several Great Lakers members, some former GMC assembly plant workers, and a former GMC Motorhome Engineer, Karl Gross. Audience members were excited to learn a little more about the GMC motorhome and asked many questions both during and after the presentation. Numerous audience members stayed after and toured the GMCs in the parking lot as well. Macomb College deserves many thanks for inviting our club to participate in this year's cultural program, and for the well-organized displays.

We are looking forward to giving the GMC presentation again in the future.

GMC Great Lakers Membership Meeting May 17, 2019 Zeeland, Michigan

President, Becky Johnson, called meeting to order at 7:12 PM

Minutes from October 2018 were approved as published in the newsletter, moved by Bill Helmore, seconded by Marlene Scarlett.

Treasurers Report: per John Shotwell, Becky reported a 2018 year end balance of \$12,575.82. The addition of membership dues, and rally fees minus rally costs resulted in a current balance \$13,398.92. Treasurer report approved by Marlene and seconded by Jerry Newman.

Voting for the 2020 GMC Great Lakers Executive Board positions will take place in the fall of 2019 with the election results announced at the October rally. Sara Halley, Vice President, will not seek reelection and John Shotwell is ineligible to continue on as Treasurer since he has held the position for three consecutive years. The nominating committee members for 2019 are: John Pryzbylek, Jerry Newman, and Jeff Rider.

2019 rally schedule: June 10 - 14 in Shipshewana, hosted by Marv and Sally Miller, registration due by May 27. July 24 - 28 in Plain City, Ohio, hosted by the Halleys, Hamptons and Wilsons. August 22 - 25 at Groveland Oaks in Holly, Michigan, hosted by Nancy and Peter Donaghue. Includes an optional tour of Meadow Brook Hall (mini Biltmore). Group campsite includes electric and only two water hydrants. Details forthcoming in GL newsletter. September 8 - 15 Do Nothing Rally at Algonac State Park in Michigan. Make your own reservations for as few or as many days as you'd like. October's rally will be at the GMCMI convention in Mansfield Ohio, October 4 -10. Members were asked to think about campgrounds for 2020 rallies and send their suggestions to Becky.

Membership chair, Steve Johnson, reported February 2018 club membership was 109. December 2018 was 120. February 2019 membership reported at 100 plus 6 new members. Of the 131 dues renewal notices sent out, 3 no longer have a GMC coach, some had medical issues and some will renew later. There were 22 with no response and 10 have an expired FMCA membership.

New members present: Dan and Gail DePrekel from Michigan with a '75 Eleganza II, John Calhoun and Becky Curless from Indiana with a '76 Eleganza, and Doug and Natalie Laverdiere from Michigan with a '76 Eleganza II.

John and Deb Pryzbylek's name was pulled to win mileage cost to this rally and John and Rita Stehlik won a free rally.

Thanks to Becky for designing the T-shirts.

John Pryzbylek, GL newsletter editor, solicited input from members for recipes, stories, technical tips, items for sale / free for the taking and pictures are all welcome in the newsletter.

Steve Johnson, GL Webmaster, also asked for information to be added to our website and for sale ads are welcome.

Jerry Newman moved and Deb Pryzbylek seconded to adjourn meeting at 7:45 PM.

2019 Nominating Committee

Each spring one important part of club business is to form a nominating committee to prepare the ballot for the fall election of club board members for the following year. This year's nominating committee members are Jerry Newman, John Pryzbylek, and Jeff Rider.

Each of the officers (president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer) is eligible to serve for three consecutive years in a given position, if reelected. While the FMC national and alternate national directors and director-at-large can be reelected each year, without limitation. Additional information on duties of each club board member can be found in the Standing Rules document on the club website "Members Only" section.

Per our By-Laws, the role of the nominating committee is to identify candidates for the fall election of the club board member positions president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, FMCA national director, alternate FMCA national director, and director-at-large for the next calendar year. Any interested club member can submit their name for any position to a committee member. The nominating committee makes sure the member is eligible and qualified to serve in the position and obtains a member's commitment to fulfill the duties of the office should they be voted into the position by the club membership. Our current club officers, Becky Johnson, President and Bea Newman, Secretary are eligible to serve in their current positions for one more year. Sara Halley is stepping down as Vice President effective December 31, 2019 and we will need a new Vice President for 2020. John Shotwell has completed three consecutive one-year terms as club Treasurer, and is ineligible to continue as club Treasurer in 2020 so; we will need a new, qualified club Treasurer.

Election ballots are sent out in late August/early September to all eligible club members, and results are mailed or emailed to the nominating committee. Election results are announced at the October rally each year.

Raspberry Cream Pie

This pie is awesome, it leaves people begging for more!

Crust

2 cups graham cracker crumbs 1/4 cup maple syrup 6 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted

Raspberry topping

1 1/3 cup sugar6 tablespoons cornstarch1/8 teaspoon salt2 cups water6 to 7 tablespoons maple syrup1 pint fresh raspberries

Cream Cheese Filling

4 oz cream cheese 1/2 cup powdered sugar 8 oz whipped cream, Cool Whip or make some from heavy cream

For the Crust

Preheat the oven to 375 F. Mix together the maple syrup and melted butter, add the graham cracker crumbs and mix. Press into a deep-dish 9" pie pan. Bake crust for 6 minutes. Set aside to cool.

Raspberry Topping

Mix together sugar, cornstarch, and salt in a medium saucepan. Add 1/2 cup water and whisk until smooth. Add the remaining water, maple syrup and raspberries. Cook over a medium heat until thickened. Stir constantly, be patient it takes a while. Bring the mixture just to a boil but don't let it boil. If using frozen raspberries reduce water by 1/2 cup. Set aside to cool.

Cream Cheese Filling

With a food processor or hand mixer, beat together cream cheese, powdered sugar and whipped topping until combined and smooth. Spread over the cooled graham cracker crust. Then spoon the cooled raspberry topping over the cream cheese filling. Place the pie in the fridge to cool and set, about 2 hrs. Serve as is or add whipped topping to it.

You can be traveling in an RV, car, plane, ship, or motorcycle to be eligible for this benefit. If you are a full-time RVer, you are always considered 100 miles from home. Some exclusions and limitation amounts pertain to this benefit.

FMCAssist coverage is provided by Seven Corners and is underwritten by Lloyd's of London.

What do you need to do to enroll in this program? Absolutely nothing! As long as you are an active FMCA member and your FMCA dues are current, you have coverage.

All of these benefits **must be arranged** by Seven Corners in order to be covered. If you have a medical emergency, dial 9-1-1; consult with a physician; then, call Seven Corners at (877) 202-4176, in advance if you need to use these services. The collect (worldwide) number is (317) 582-2619.
