"Friends of the GMC Great Lakers"

Last fall the GMC Great Lakers created a new club affiliation called the "Friends of the GMC Great Lakers". This non-member classification does not require a concurrent membership in FMCA. Participation as a "Friend of the GMC Great Lakers" is an annual invitation and those nominated and approved must respond to the invitation in order to continue their participation. A participant as "Friends of the GMC Great Lakers" is not considered membership in the club and thus these individuals have no voting rights within the club. "Friends of the GMC Great Lakers" will receive the club newsletter and membership roster (but will not be listed as a club member as they are not members of FMCA). They will pay no annual dues and are invited to participate in club rallies, as guests of the club, paying no rally participation fees. (They are however responsible for their own lodging fees at any rally they attend.) The GMC Great Lakers Standing Rules has been updated to include this Non Membership category, in addition to regular Full Club Membership and Associate Club Memberships.

Any current or former club member (and spouse when applicable) must be invited by the Great Lakers Board of Directors to participate as a "Friends of the Great Lakers" and meet the following criteria for nomination and approval:

- 1. The nominee must have been a club member or associate member in the club within the past 5 years prior to the initial invitation to participate.
- 2. The nominee must have made a significant contribution to the GMC Great Lakers as a board member, rally host, or another significant club role.
- 3. The nominee must no longer own a GMC motorhome, or any other recreational vehicle for camping.
- 4. Nominees are not required to have a current FMCA membership.
- 5. Any club member can submit nominees using the "Friends of the Great Lakers" nomination form. These are reviewed and approved by the Board at the last rally of the camping season.
- 6. Invitations to "Friends of the GMC Great Lakers" are sent by the Board to approved nominees before the end of the calendar year and those individuals must reply to be part of this affiliation prior to the start of the next club membership year.
- 7. Approved nominees who agree to be part of the "Friends of the Great Lakers" are sent to the club's Membership Chair to include in a comprehensive list for the club and website.
- 8. "Friends of the Great Lakers" members must be approved annually.

The application for future "Friends of the GMC Great Lakers" will be available on the club website and can be submitted to Bill Helmore and Dick Serreyn, who will be chairing the "Friends of the Great Lakers" committee.

GMC GREAT LAKERS HISTORY – Part 2 1977 Growing and Maturing

The National Organization and the GMC clubs chose the International Code of Flags to identify the GMC club chapters. The purpose for employing the "International Code of Flags" was to initiate a unique manner of identification for the GMC Owners Clubs that was totally distinctive to those being used by any other motorhome clubs. They therefore selected a method that is almost as old as the sailing vessels of the high seas, for which the code of identification has been in use for centuries to identify ships at sea, or relate messages across the distances.



Ultimately the "International Code of Flags" was adopted both for its special interest and its virtual simplicity for identification on national and international scales.

Each club has their own Code of Flags. The flags indicate the first letter in each name of the Club. When two names make up the chapter designation, as in "Great Lakers," a second flag is assigned to complete the insignia.

1977 found the GMC family of motorhome clubs at fifteen (15) nationally. The Great Lakers "Spring Kickoff Outing" was held on May 13th to 15th at Groveland Oaks County Park for the second year in a row. Old and new friends gathered around the campfire Friday night.

Saturday's sunshine put everyone in a good mood and while the gals visited and made yarn craft mobiles, worked on their needlepoint, crocheted and embroidered, the guys visited and joined a lawn game tournament.

The tables groaned under Saturday night's potluck, however it didn't take long to relieve them of their burden. After dinner, it was on to the pavilion, a pleasant walk by the lake, a view of the beach and the islands as Geoff Baxter, the square dance caller, summoned the Great Lakers and the Ford Wagon Train to swing their partners.

After a worship service and business meeting Sunday morning, the Great Lakers played volleyball. With no poles available, the Great Lakers used two motorhomes instead! At the business meeting the officers for the new year were sworn in. They were Virgil Barbe, President: Bob Beyer, First Vice President: William Helmore, Second Vice President: L.L. "Mac" McKenzie, Treasurer: Ann Schipper, Secretary and Pete Zunitch, National Director.

Let's Go Gourmet was the theme of the June 10th to 12th rally at Lake Chemung Outdoor Resort in Howell, Michigan. It started with dinner at a local restaurant Friday night followed by Mac McKenzie showing his slides from several of last year's rallies and a couple of trips they had taken. Rain didn't stop the steak roast with Kellerman's marinade, a salad bar and hot rolls provided by Betty Bookout. The celebrating continued at the cakewalk.

A grill was offered to the GMC Clubs by McMullen RV Dealer (a GMC motorhome dealer) in Pontiac, MI. They wanted the local Club to have the first chance at it, so after George Schipper looked at it, the grill was acquired by the Great Lakers prior to the June rally and the Sextons donated a propane tank.

Timber Shores at Northport, Michigan was the site of the Club's July rally. After dinner on Friday it was time to get acquainted with guests and new members at the campfire. It took until Saturday before all twenty-three coaches arrived. Saturday morning found the Dennis' preparing the best barbecue ever for the evening dinner. Helen Kellerman had prepared owl craft kits for the ladies and the little buggers made cork Hippies while Emmett Dennis slowly roasted the ribs on the grill. A lot of time was spent watching the ribs slowly turn to a juicy brown. Ed Kurtz relieved Emmett during the six hours they cooked...and finally...they were ready. The baked potatoes had been cooked in the coals of the barbecue and fifty-seven people sat down to enjoy all of this plus super salads and desserts.

The tables were cleared and a bingo game got under way. The game was frequently stopped to pick up rocks to use as markers. The game was run by Jim Kellerman, Ed Kurtz and Bill Helmore. The evening was topped off by Herb Lee's slides of the Groveland Oaks County Park rally.

Also, in July, FMCA held their Summer Convention at the Fairgrounds in Syracuse, New York. The convention was preceded by a GMC pre-convention rally at Verona Beach State Park near Syracuse. Nine Great Lakers met at the Silverdome in Pontiac for a caravan to Syracuse. In route the caravan picked up two coaches in Port Huron, Michigan and two more outside London, Ontario, Canada. Thursday night was spent at a campground east of Buffalo, New York where the rest of the seventeen Great Lakers met for the final leg to Verona Beach. This was a first for the GMC clubs since the park was a day use park and the GMCers were the first to stay overnight. The pre-convention rally was filled with games, seminars, food and service by area GMC dealers. The high point of this rally was the dinner-dance at Trinkaus Manor Restaurant Sunday night. All the GMCers boarded buses for the trip to and from the restaurant. On Monday the GMC Clubs caravanned to the FMCA convention site for their doings.

On the evening of July 23, 1977 the McDonnels informed those present of a major change in the National GMC Motorhome Owners organization. The change was that it would now be known as "The GMC Motorhome Owners Association, Incorporated" (GMC-MOA). The Association was not a part of FMCA and each GMC Club and its members were given the chance to belong to the GMC-MOA and/or the FMCA.

Three Braves Campground at Buchanan, Michigan was the site of the GMC Great Lakers August 13th to 15th rally. On Saturday a tour of the wine making area of Southwest Michigan was made. The Great Lakers toured a winery and sampled some Michigan wine.

The September 9th to 11th rally was a special event in the Great Lakers history. For the first time three clubs got together for a rally. The GMC Great Lakers hosted the GMC Country and the GMC Western Reserve clubs of Ohio at Sunny's Campground in Wauseon, Ohio. About fifty (50) GMCs were parked in two rows, boy what a sight!

The Lappans and the Leopards entertained the Great Lakers in Alpena, Michigan with so much imagination and flair that the October rally is remembered as one of the biggest and best. The fall color that weekend was just beginning to peak. When we reached the turn off, the arrows, streamers and signs pointed the way to a ride through the deep woods. Signs posted on the trees told us that Las Vagus was just ahead. When we reached the clearing, there was a lodge and a cookhouse to house us during whatever weather came. Parking turned out not to be a problem, however we filled all available space. Saturday started with showers that lulled some into extra forty winks. The day was filled with games and visiting. There were tours of the Doctors Club by a four-wheel drive vehicle and everyone was amazed at the number of deer and other game. The supper of baked ham, baked beans, scalloped potatoes, deserts and salads was topped off with fresh, pre-buttered French bread. Paul Brace set up the movie screen and showed the sound and color film of the Nashville rally while the tables were cleared and the games setup. The dealers and pitmen arrived looking very professional in green eyeshades and enticed and encouraged us to play cards, dice, roulette, etc. with the \$50,000 all were given. The winnings were used in a blind auction for some nice prizes.


SURVEY OF THE GMC GREAT LAKERS MEMBERS

The FMCA 100th International Convention August 14 – 17, 2019

After driving for eight days across four states and 1,085 miles we arrived in Minot, North Dakota.

There were board meetings on Monday, Tuesday, meeting Wednesday. and the main on There was a lot of discussion on the budget and the fact that FMCAssist was dropped because of the cost. It would create a \$378,452 deficit. Seven Corners told FMCA to expect a 15 to 20% increase in premiums. Then came back with a 73.3% increase, as a result of Seven Corners changing how they assess premium costs. In the past they were using a claim loss ratio to determine pricing, but are now adding in overhead and indirect costs, and told FMCA to take it or leave it. The board members wanted to keep FMCAssist and voted to keep it. Then, voted to increase dues \$25, to \$75.00 per year (renewing members) to pay for it. Then voted to limit the number of years you can pay dues in advance to three (3).

Another major issue was the purchase of new software from PROTECH to replace the 5-year-old Elan system at a cost of \$285,000. It was voted on and passed.

Another item was about the area vice president's responsibilities. They are required to obtain a copy of all FMCA club tax filings and notifications within 30 days of the filing or notification. Each club must give FMCA a copy of their federal IRS tax return. There were about 50 items requiring a vote. I have the book if anyone wants to review the topics and items discussed.

Pet safety, Nimble Wireless and the Youth Activities program were dropped.

The following national officers were elected or reelected:

John Walker was re-elected National president, Rett Porter was re-elected National vice president, Katie Balogh was elected National secretary and, John Reynolds was re-elected National Treasurer.

We visited the Square Lake Sewage Lagoon, listed in the Minot Visitors Guide and discovered the attraction of the sewage lagoon is bird watching.

We also visited a museum in Polson, Montana that has the first front wheel drive motorhome powered

by a 1966 Olds Toronado engine. The body is a 1947 Spartan travel trailer with a fabricated GMC truck front end. The rear wheels are the tandem wheels from the trailer. They claim GMC looked at the steering when General Motors was building the GMC motorhomes.



You can be traveling in an RV, car, plane, ship, or motorcycle to be eligible for this benefit. If you are a full-time RVer, you are always considered 100 miles from home. Some exclusions and limitation amounts pertain to this benefit.

FMCAssist coverage is provided by Seven Corners and is underwritten by Lloyd's of London.

What do you need to do to enroll in this program? Absolutely nothing! As long as you are an active FMCA member and your FMCA dues are current, you have coverage.

All of these benefits **must be arranged** by Seven Corners in order to be covered. If you have a medical emergency, dial 9-1-1; consult with a physician; then, call Seven Corners at (877) 202-4176, in advance if you need to use these services. The collect (worldwide) number is (317) 582-2619.
