## 2020 Rally Season Update

In a normal year, our club members enjoy lots of socializing at Great Lakers rallies. We have first rally night potluck snacks we share. We enjoy early morning coffee hour with breakfast foods each day of a rally. We enjoy getting together for group meals (sometimes every day) – catered or homemade.

The best thing about Great Lakers rallies is all of the time we spend together eating, talking, sharing, touring, and kibitzing with one another.

But 2020 is not a normal year, with the unexpected impact of the Coronavirus. All of us have spent months sheltering in place, in order to avoid unknown exposures while trying to help the health care systems from being overwhelmed. The Great Lakers club is affected by the Coronavirus as well.

#### What are the Coronavirus facts?

- The virus is still around us today. It has not gone away.
- The virus is spread mainly from person-to-person contact through respiratory droplets.
- Individuals who are not showing any symptoms of the virus can spread the virus.
- Michigan has been and still is a virus 'hot spot' in the country.
- There currently is no vaccine to protect us against the virus and won't be one for quite awhile.

### What are the CDC (Center for Disease Control) advisories?

- Everyone should avoid large group gatherings.
- When in contact with others, maintain at least 6 feet of social distancing.
- Eliminate buffet style food service, self serve food, and self serve drinks.
- Individuals travelling risk transmitting the virus to others outside of their communities and risk being infected and bringing the virus back to their own community.
- Older people or those with serious underlying medical conditions are at the highest risk to becoming seriously ill if they contract the virus. It is advised to reduce their risks (such as staying home if possible), until enough people have immunity to the virus. Most of the Great Lakers members fall into this category.

Based on CDC advisories and what Great Lakers rallies are all about, the Great Lakers Board has discussed what this means for 2020 rallies. I have researched the CDC advisories, recommendations from WHO (World Health Organization), and have even consulted with our former parent organization, FMCA, about what to do regarding club rallies. A new document for 2020 on the FMCA website states in part, "All attendees to a Rally are advised that if they are age 65 or over, or have any health risks such as asthma, heart problems, chronic lung or kidney disease, diabetes, compromised immune system, liver disease, or server obesity, they are at greater risk of serious illness or death if they contract COVID-19. <u>Any individual with any of these ailments or conditions are advised not to attend a Rally"</u>.

The Board has agreed that there is a very high risk to both our club and to our individual members if we meet together at a club rally at this point in time. <u>Thus, the Board has voted to cancel the August rally at Addison Oaks County Park in Leonard, Michigan. The October 2020 Great Lakers Club rally viability will be decided on in a few months, based on updated CDC advisories.</u>

#### What can Great Lakers members do now?

- Camping and RV travel is considered low risk, when going by yourselves or with your family.
- Continue to practice social distancing, sanitizing, and wearing facemasks to protect yourself anywhere you go outside your home.
- Camp in your GMC at your local recreational facilities, in order to avoid added risks from outside your community.
- Find and share campground information with Nancy Donaghue (club VP) about locations for potential 2021 rallies.

Many, many activities all around us have been cancelled, as well as routine group gatherings. Returning back to normal for all of us must be done with extreme caution, especially at club hosted rallies. Let's hope and pray that the continued efforts of health experts will result in a proven vaccine against the virus before next year's 2021 Great Lakers rally season. In the meantime, enjoy your GMC on your own, stay healthy, and stay safe.

### **1981 BACK IN THE FMCA FOLD**

The Annual Birthday Rally was held the weekend of January 17<sup>th</sup> at the Holiday Inn Holidome in Jackson, Michigan. At the business meeting the new officers were installed. They are: Virgil Barbe, President; Dennis Esper, Vice President; Bill Helmore, Treasurer; Shirley Davis, Secretary and Ron Kirkland, National Director. Bob Staub became Vice President when Dennis Esper did not rejoin the Club because of the sale of his motorhome. As the year begins the Club has seventy-three (73) members.

The GMC Great Lakers Motorhome Club was rechartered with FMCA on March 10<sup>th</sup> per a vote of the membership last year.

In May of this year Red Holman GMC of Westland, Michigan extended an offer of a discount program to GMC Motorhome owners, this program was called "The Red Holman GMC Motorhome 10-15 Club." It offers a 10% discount on service and 15% discount on parts at Red Holman GMC Co. There were no membership fees or club dues, it was free. The GMC Great Lakers members were the first GMCers to be offered this savings opportunity.

Chalk up another great rally for the GMC Great Lakers at the Duke Creek KOA in Cedar Springs the weekend of May 8<sup>th</sup>. On Saturday all experienced some good food, a day of warmth and sunshine, a shopping trip to Rockford and plenty of time for relaxing, renewing old friendships and meeting some of the Club's new members.

The GMC Great Lakers vanity plate became available through the treasurer at rallies or by mail. The plastic plates are white background with blue lettering.

In addition to the Club's regular rallies, about a dozen Great Lakers took in the GLASS (Great Lakes Area Spring Spree) rally at Centreville, Michigan over the Memorial weekend. This is a regional FMCA rally hosted by the Michigan Knights of the Highway, a chapter of FMCA also. These folks are gangbusters at knowing how to really put on a rally. There was always something going on, it seems like, from catered meals to every imaginable type of entertainment. Many of the FMCA commercial members set up displays of motorhomes, rv supplies and crafts.

For the June rally, it's off to Cedar Point's Camp Village in Sandusky, Ohio. Do to the nature of this rallies activities no meal on Saturday was planned, however the coffee pots were kept gotng with donuts on Saturday morning. It was felt that so many of the members will be "doing their thing" at the park that most of the members would not want to take the time to come back for a potluck or whatever, plus they'll probably be too "stuffed" from all the "goodies" available at the park to really want to "get into" a big meal. In the park itself there are several stage shows, exhibits, crafts, a seaquarium show, as well as rides of all kinds.

The fourth annual "fun in the sun" summer rally was held July 10<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> at Pioneer Park north of Muskegon, Michigan. There was sunning, swimming, boating, golfing plus just plain old relaxation on the shores of Lake Michigan. A catered meal of barbecue chicken, barbecue ribs, potato salad, baked beans, fruit salad, rolls and butter plus for desert was served Saturday evening.

Christmas in August was the theme of the August rally at the Frankenmuth RV Park in Frankenmuth, Michigan. All attendees received a goody bag full of all kinds of neat stuff,

exchanged Christmas gifts, sang Christmas carols and even had a visit from jolly old St. Nick. Saturday's evening meal was a traditional holiday meal of roast turkey, ham, mashed potatoes, stuffing, gravy, all the trimmings and a wide selection of desserts. Some of the members really went out in decorating their coaches in the Christmas spirit. In the judging, Bob Sovis won a GMC Motorhome hot wheel as first prize. At the business meeting it was announced that the new bylaws were approved and were officially in effect.

The Board unanimously agreed to bring this recommendation to the club members. By the time the 2021 Rally season begins, we are hopeful the world will be closer to being back to normal, that a Coronavirus vaccine will be readily available, and enough people will be immune to the virus. Our goal is for the club to do in 2021 what we had originally planned for 2020. All current Board members have agreed to serve an additional year in 2021, in their positions.
