
OCTOBER CAMPING OPPORTUNITY (NOT A RALLY!)

For those of you who would like to take out your GMC motorhome and camp with other Great Lakers members, the Great Lakers have arranged to keep the group sites at Camp Turkeyville from our original October rally this year. We have 25 campsites set aside for anyone who would like to go to Camp Turkeyville near Marshall, MI. The campsites are arranged for check-in on Thursday October 15, 2020 and departure on Sunday October 18, 2020. The special group rate is \$45 per night (the regular rate is \$52 per night). The campsites set aside for the Great Lakers will be held for members to reserve until September 15, 2020. 1982 A Year of Special Events

A surprising number of the Great Lakers members turned out for what has become an annual affair, the Sixth Annual Great Lakers Birthday rally party was held at the Holiday Inn Holidome in Jackson, Michigan on the 15th to 17th of January. Much fun, fellowship and a great time for all was in store for all those attending. The officers for this year were installed at the business meeting, were; Virgil Barbe, President; Bob Stoub, Vice President; Bill Helmore, Treasurer; Shirley Davis, Secretary; Ron Kirkland, National Director and Norm Anderson, Alternate National Director.

The Club's annual spring kick off rally took place at Groveland Oaks County Park in Holly, Michigan the weekend of May 14th to 16th. This was a weekend for catching up with all of the happenings of old friends. A potluck for Saturday night, coffee and rolls for Saturday morning and as usual Sunday morning pancake breakfast were the only activities planned.

Nineteen family members attended the June rally at Sterling State Park in Monroe, Michigan. This rally featured a spaghetti dinner complete with salads, desserts and wine. Many of the members participated in a bocce ball or golf tournament for which prizes were awarded.

Fifteen (15) coaches departed the State Park on Sunday morning June 13th for the trip to Knoxville, Tennessee and the World's Fair. Two (2) coaches joined the caravan in route, bringing the count to seventeen (17) Great Lakers. Sunday night the group stopped at the KOA south of Lexington, Kentucky. Monday morning the group headed for Knoxville and Fireside Campground, our headquarters for the fair.




