GMC GREAT LAKERS HISTORY - Part 11

THE 1986 BYLAWS GET REVISED

The Tenth Annual Birthday Party was held the weekend of January 10th – 12th at Midway Motor Lodge in Lansing, Michigan. Several of the club members stayed Friday night, many stayed Saturday night and several more came over just for the get together on Saturday night. At the dinner meeting the new officers were installed, they are: Alex Birch, President; Ivan Johnson, First Vice President; Jim Gompers, Second Vice President; Wilma Spaeth, Treasurer; Tillie Nestle, Secretary; Jack Hoglin, National Director and Bill Gamble, Alternate National Director. Al announced at the meeting the appointment of a committee to look over the club's bylaws and make recommendations to the club Members for their approval.

The Moss County Park in Orlando, Florida area was the site where fourteen Great Lakers gathered for a special winter rally on February 3rd – 10th. Regular campfires, potluck meals, fun and friendships prevailed. Numerous outings were made to many of the local attractions, including Orlando to take in a show at Rose O' Grady's Gin Mill at the Church Street Station.

Production films of the GMC motorhome and the movie "Stripes" were viewed by the attendees and included with bags of popcorn to munch upon. Saturday found everyone just wandering around gabbing and swapping stories and at noon the hosts presented a lunch of homemade bean soup and baked bread. Another fabulous potluck dinner was served up on Saturday evening, followed by a business meeting and bingo games, complete with prizes. The rally was closed by the regular Sunday morning pancake breakfast.

The GLASS rally, hosted by the Michigan Knights of the Highway, was held over the Memorial Day weekend at the Calhoun County Fairgrounds in Marshall, Michigan. Although this is not an official Great Lakers affair, a great number of the members like to take this in as a group. Al Birch made arrangements for the group to meet at a truck stop north of town and caravan into the rally on Friday. He arranged for the club to park together in a corral type building. The GLASS rally is always a real fun time with something to do every minute.

It was off to the Camper Village complex at Cedar Point in Sandusky, Ohio the weekend of June $27^{th} - 29^{th}$. Twenty-three coaches partook of the entertainment provided by this amusement park. While no formal meeting or meals were scheduled for this rally everyone had more than adequate time to rub elbows and chew the fat with each other.

While the weatherman did not give his wholehearted cooperation, twenty-three member coaches took in the July rally at the Sunshine Valley Campground located near Omer, Michigan. Intermittent showers slowed down some of the activities and postponed the 9:00 AM canoe trip. The trip was rescheduled for 1 PM and about sixteen of the club's members boarded the bus to go to the drop site. A great potluck dinner was held on Saturday evening featuring all the specialties of the club's cooking staff. A very informative meeting followed the dinner where a great variety of subjects were discussed.

Twenty-two Great Lakers parked with the GMC International Chapter at this year's FMCA Summer Convention held at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington, Kentucky. The parking was on rolling terrain that necessitated wheel blocking similar to brand X coaches. The GMC group had one of the better sites, with many shade trees to break up the 90 degree plus days. Al Birch presented a seminar on the history and manufacture of the GMC motorhomes.

The weekend of August $1^{st} - 3^{rd}$ the club motored to Selfridge Air Base at Mount Clemens, Michigan for the Air Show. About forty coaches took this one in and had front row seats on the fifty-yard line. The Air Show was nothing short of fantastic and transportation was provided to all of the near city attractions. The meal and cocktail party at the Officers Club and the museum trips were all greeted by a lot of ooohs and aaahs.

The West Wind KOA at Saugatuck, Michigan was the site where thirty Great Lakers gathered the weekend of August 8th – 10th. An impromptu Friday night dinner party was put together at the Coral Gables Restaurant, which is directly on the Kalamazoo River overlooking all the boats and activities. For Saturday, arrangements were made for the Club to tour a nearby passenger ship, which is open for public tours. The city of Saugatuck's Dial-a-ride buses were put into action to provide transportation to the ship and downtown.

The September rally in Brown County Indiana (Nashville, Indiana) was a Wednesday thru Sunday affair. A total of thirty-three coaches eventually took in the activities that were planned with twenty-two coaches gathering in Auburn, Indiana for the kick off of the rally. Thursday morning started with the hosts delivering donuts door to door in pouring rain. By midmorning it was off to the Indy Speedway for the museum and a bus tour of the Speedway track. Rain by the buckets full came down as the caravan headed for Nashville making for a slow and tedious drive to the campground. Friday featured tours of the surrounding Columbus area, shopping in Nashville and the evening trip to the Little Grand Opry. The Saturday evening banquet offered something for everyone and all you could eat.

The final rally of the year found twenty-five coaches at Groveland Oaks County Park in Holly, Michigan the weekend of October $10^{th}-12^{th}$. Friday evening featured hot cinnamon cider and home baked cookies. Saturday morning most members went off to visit and shop at the Japanese Gardens, Candle Factory and a cider mill. The noon meal featured the Birch's famed soup kettle and Peg Hoaglin's homemade bran muffins. The afternoon activities consisted of a potato race, egg toss, water filled balloon toss and other games. Saturday evening again featured a potluck dinner in front of a roaring fire. The Halloween costume contest was won by the Beatty's for their Raggedy Ann and Andy attire.
